Because of this, anything that has NECA/IBEW Local 48's name on it, or associated with it, needs to be approved by the Local's Business Manager and NECA Chapter's Executive Manager.

Before NECA/IBEW Local 48 puts their logo on any merchandise, or supports a charity, several factors are considered, including – does the merchandise or charity use/support unions? Do their values align with the partnership's? How do they treat their workers?



Whenever NECA/IBEW Local 48 has their name and logo associated with a product or a service, you can be assured that it represents quality.

Focus on the task at hand

Perform personal business, including cell phone use, during authorized break periods only.

When NECA/IBEW Local 48 contractors and electricians are on a job site, the partnership expects members to focus on that job alone.

Customers pay for our members' time on the jobsite, so while on the clock, a worker's focus and attention should be 100 percent on the task at hand. Just like contractors expect eight hours of work for eight hours of pay, our customers expect our members to work when they say they are going to work.

Workers should refrain from dealing with personal business on the clock because when people get distracted, accidents can happen. An active job site can have many potential hazards, so it is important for workers to be focused on what is happening around them – as well as the task they are currently performing.

By making sure that any distractions are limited to designed break periods, NECA/IBEW Local 48 members help ensure that the customers get the best work they paid for, but also that the job site stays safe as possible.
