Respecting tools

Use the proper tool for the job while maintaining personal responsibility for our tools

Maintaining tools and using them correctly helps keep people safe. Not using the tool the job calls for, or allowing personal tools to fall into disrepair can lead to dangerous situations where people could get hurt. NECA/IBEW Local 48 members must take every precaution to ensure safety, and that includes tool maintenance.

When workers have to stop work to deal with broken tools, or accidents caused by broken tools or using the wrong tool, can put a job behind schedule and over budget. Fixing damage takes time away from finishing tasks for the contacted job and creates unnecessary costs. Worker should take responsibility for maintaining their own tools and using them in the proper way.
